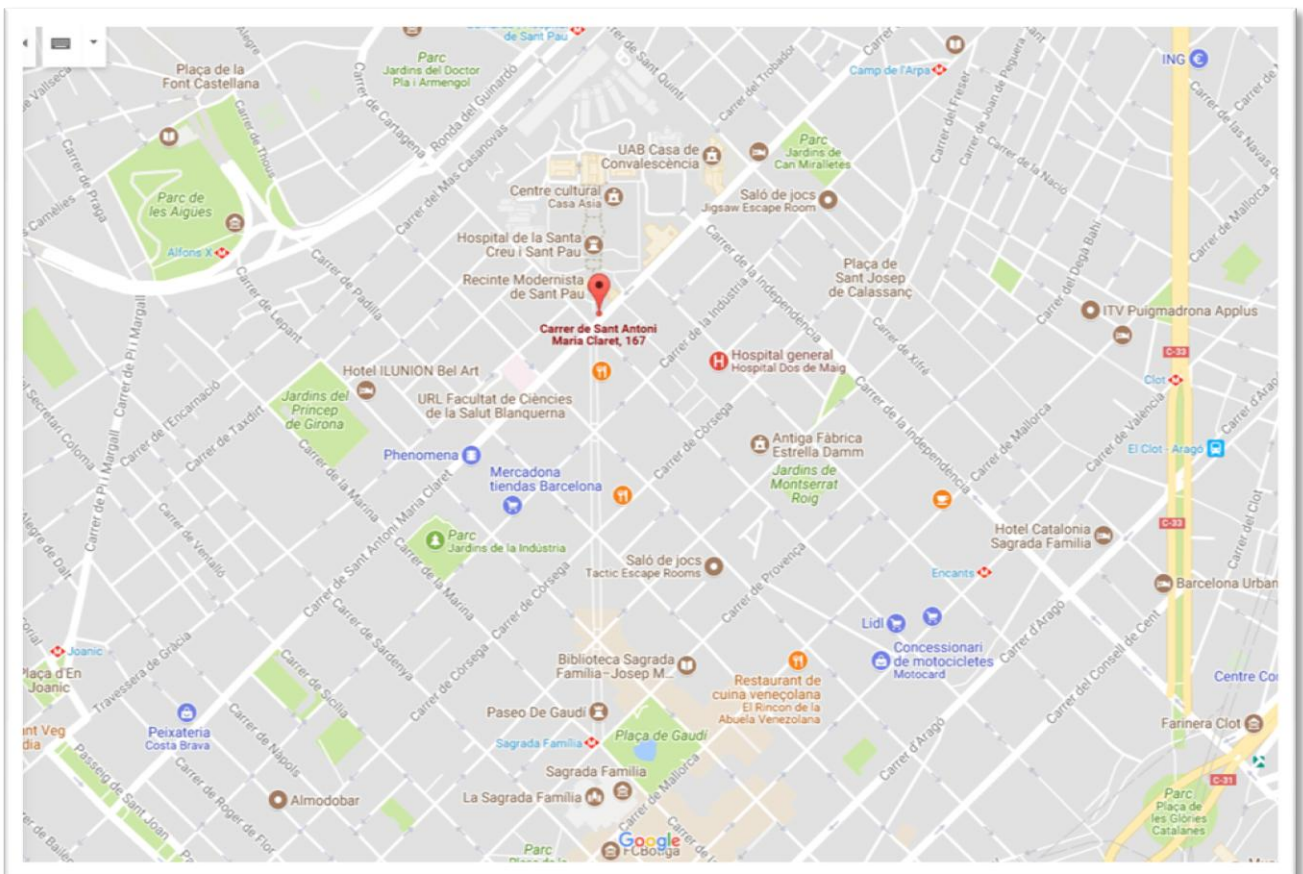

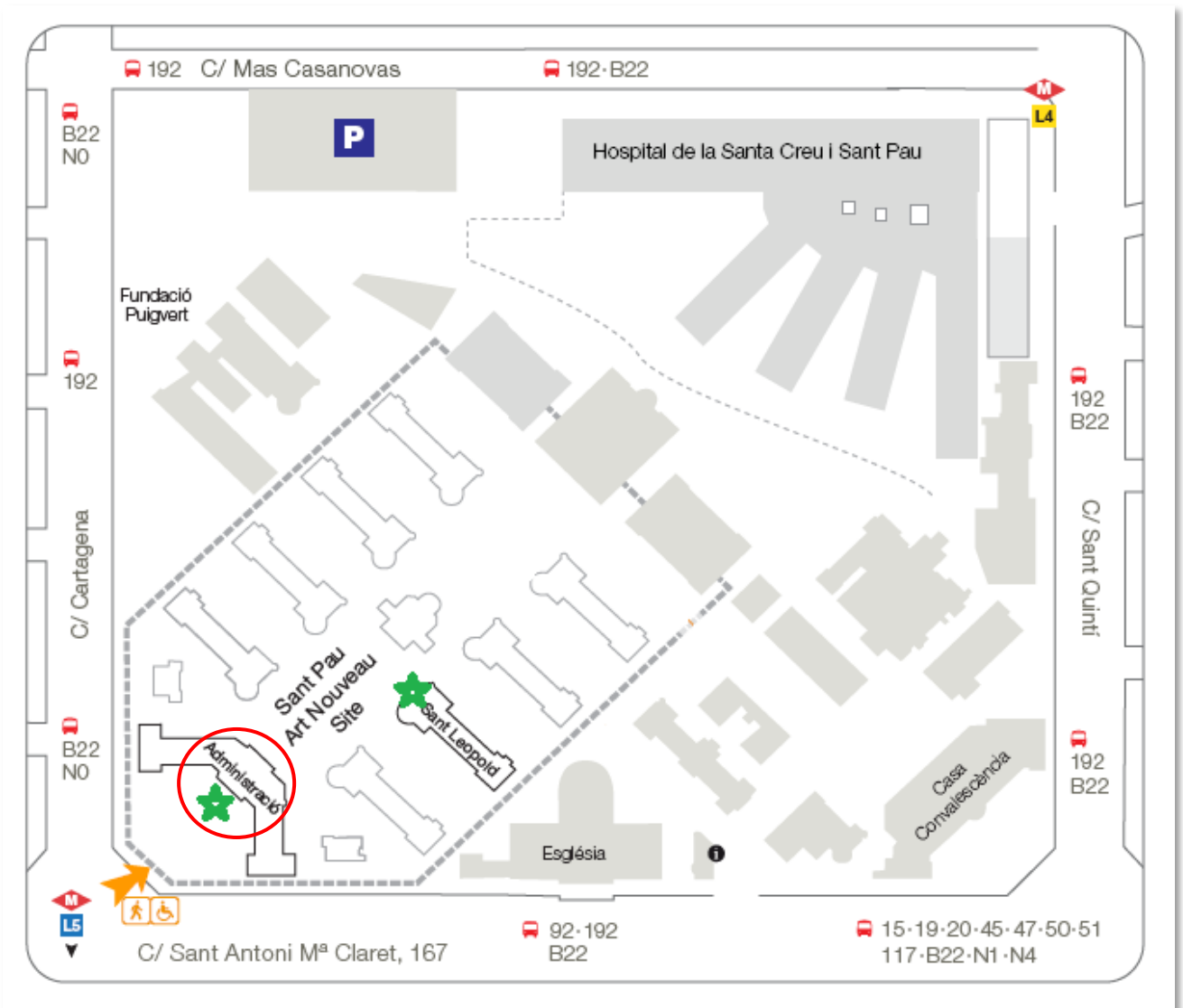

The Sumforest Conference will take place in the **Auditorium of the Administration Pavilion** of Sant Pau (Administració; see red circle on the map below).



Security issues and access

Security at Sant Pau is very strict and there is a protocol in place to register all visitors to the site in advance of their visit. **Therefore for the Sumforest Conference registration we ask you to indicate the document number of your passport or ID card you are using for travelling to Barcelona. You will then need to show this document to the guards on entering Sant Pau.**

To access Sant Pau you should enter the site via the main entrance gate at the Administration Pavilion (Administració), through Street Sant Antoni Maria Claret with Street Cartagena. You have to present your identification document (passport, ID card) to Security whereupon you will be given a visitor's badge. Swipe your visitor's badge over the magnetic card reader on top of the baffle gate to gain access. You should ensure to retain your visitor's badge for the duration of your visit, since you need it again when leaving the area.

Public transport in the city to get to Sant Pau

Metro, bus

- Yellow line (L4) to Guinardó/Hospital de Sant Pau
- Blue line (L5) to Sant Pau/Dos de Maig
- If you arrive to Barcelona by train to Sants Estació you may take L5 in the same train station
- Bus connections are indicated in the map above

By **taxi** please indicate: Sant Pau Hospital, entrance at Calle Cartagena with Calle Sant Antoni Maria Claret.

Barcelona Airport El Prat (BCN)

The airport is located 14 km southwest from the city centre. It has 2 terminals **T1** (the new one, recently opened, where most of the airlines operate) and **T2** (the old one, which is divided into T2A, T2B and T2C). Please pay attention to your flight terminal, as this may lead to some confusion when departing from Barcelona! There is a free bus connection between terminals, which takes around 10 minutes.

Transportation from/to the Airport

There are several options to travel from BCN to the city and vice versa (bus, train, metro, taxi, etc.).

By Taxi

There are taxi stops in front of Terminal 1 and Terminal 2.

Costs around 30-35 EURO and takes 25-30 minutes, depending on the traffic.

By Aerobús

We recommend taking Aerobús (A1 or A2) rather than the other regular buses. The journey takes around 30 minutes. Price 5,90 EURO single, 10,20 EURO return up to 9 days later.

Please, make sure which terminal you need to reach. Aerobús bus lines **run separately to Terminal 1 and Terminal 2**. All Aerobús lines mark clearly the terminal that they reach.

At the airport, Aerobús stops are located outside both terminals. Buses are blue and marked as "Aerobús".

By train

The L2 Line of RENFE links the **Terminal 2** of Barcelona airport with various train stations. In Barcelona city, passengers can reach the "Airport Train" from the following train stations:

- Passeig de Gràcia
- Barcelona Sants Station
- el Prat (Line R2 North)
- From Estació de França Station passengers must take the R2 train line South.

Trains depart every 30 minutes more or less. It is recommended to travel with time, RENFE trains are usually delayed.

By metro

The line L9 (orange) connects the airport with Barcelona city. This line is divided between North and South, being the **L9 South line** the one that links between Barcelona's airport and the various metro stations in the city.

The L9 South line stops at both Terminals 1 and 2 of Barcelona airport.

If you plan to stay in the city for sightseeing, we recommend buying a **T10** ticket from the train station at the airport. Cost is 10,30 EURO and you get 10 journeys up to 1h15mins for use on bus, train or metro (not Aerobus). You can use the T10 from the airport station to your hotel and it counts as one journey. More than 1 person can use the same T10 ticket, but you have to be travelling together – just validate the ticket as often as the number of people travelling.
